The Relics of the Passion, items that are believed to have touched Jesus Christ during his crucifixion, continues its tour on Guam through April 1.

Among the relics are pieces thought to be from the cross of Jesus' crucifixion, the crown of thorns, replicas of the holy nails, the burial shroud, the column of flagellation, the spear that pierced Jesus' side, the veil used to wipe Jesus' face, and a relic from the table of the Last Supper.



The relics are owned by Thomas Serafin, founder of the Apostolate for Holy Relics. Serafin has devoted his life to collecting and safeguarding holy relics.


